Introduction

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Point of departure: DARMA annual meeting 2013

- Analysis of DARMA members – their backgrounds and professional interests
 - presented by Lone Bredahl Jensen and Helen Korsgaard, SDU
 - Showed diversity as well as similarities
- Decided to establish Special Interest Groups (SIGs/ERFA-grupper)
 - Specific, everyday, task related benefit from being a member of the DARMA network

Process so far:

- Feedback from members
 - 140 members answered the survey
 - Interest areas as divers as appeared in Helen and Lones analysis
- Board decision: all SIG's will be given time for a workshop at the Annual meeting

The SIG concept:

- Bottom-up and self-supported – SIG group member are SIG group drivers
- Open to all DARMA members
- Transparency as to where and when the SIG meets and what is to be discussed (announced on DARMA homepage)
- SIG's cannot express opinions on behalf of DARMA – DARMA members cannot participate in political debates as DARMA representatives.
